Monica brought up about how children involved in meth –the drug is cheap, youth are being misdiagnosed and then they see a cheap drug to help with their symptoms, youth are being properly diagnosed with ADHD/ADD but then don't have access to this medication so they turn to meth, they are getting early diagnosed and then they see that this drug feels good, drug use is becoming more prevalent early on, youth are connecting with older men on social media and then become exposed to drugs, young mothers are being addicted to meth because they are "trying to do it all", parents have it at their home and then children get it there/generational use-parents don't hide their use, when mothers and fathers are involved in drugs the children "become forgotten" so then they struggle with mental health illness and drug use
- **B.** How can we implement in building resilient children- need for faith based mentors to help with youth to let them know that someone cares, work with CIT officers to create youth peers with adults to go into the communities and help the youth-"street team" create a program to help parents who are going to lose their children and teach them tools for recovery and trauma, youth don't have coping skills to deal with addiction to meth, use technology to reach kids about prevention, youth are seeing attractive/skinny pictures on social media and want to look like this, an app for youth to bring awareness about narcan, where to get services, drug trend projects for youth, talk to youth about their brain still developing.
