II. INTRODUCTIONS: Chrissie Parris began the meeting at 10:08AM. Groups were welcomed and introductions were done around the table. September Meeting Minutes were passed as they stand.

III. GUEST SPEAKERS:

- a. Lisa Kern- Supervisor of Health Services and Pasco County Schools discussed needs in the community. A growing trend noticed is the lack of services in schools for students in Pasco County as it relates to health. Discussed was the idea that students need access to a school nurse. American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) recommends a minimum of one school nurse in every school. In reality,

there are 37 Registered Nurses, 15 Licensed Practical Nurses, and 88 Clinic Assistances. There is a difficulty with recruitment and retention. The average annual turnover is 6-10 nurses per year (out of 37.) Students may NOT have access to nurses every day at school. About ¼ of children have a chronic health condition. 26% of Pasco County children have a chronic health condition. Title I and low performing schools have a higher number of students with chronic health conditions. Psychiatric health conditions have increased by 62% since 2008. An overall description of the job of a School Nurse Case Management was given. The number for Case Management has doubled from 2008 to 2016. There was a four-fold increase in the total number of Pasco County Students needing medication or procedures. 3 million dollars annually is spent on student health services. Research shows a direct link between health and academics. School nurses combat chronic absenteeism and coordinate intensive health outreach supports. Parent involvement is essential.

- b. Chrissie Parris BCBH-CHAT- facilitated a group Activity-Pasco Mapping. “Needs”, “Resources”, “Geographical areas to focus on” and “What do we need to know?” were discussed and the group broke to write ideas and resources on paper. Needs were discussed with a roundtable discussion. Posters written on will be evaluated.
- IV. RX COMMITTEE UPDATE:
- a. Nikesha Yarbrough updated that there was not a meeting in October due to Nation Night Out. Community surveys were taken on naloxone.

- a. Kellie Walker updated on the SRP Campaign updates (the campaign will roll out with planning in January.) She also updated that the Alcohol Initiatives Committee applied for a poster session for SRP at CADCA.

- k. Lisa- Would like more info on obtaining Narcan if or when needed for family member. Stated that she was able to purchase it from Walgreens in Hudson. In response to her question a Pharmacist stated that they had to find a prescription for it. They were able to get it without an RX, however it took much work. Lisa would like to articulate that this is a problem that needs to be addressed in our county. The pharmacy manager at Walgreens will bring this information back to Walgreens. An RX is NOT needed for Narcan. There is not a restriction and it can be gotten from a distributor next day. Prices are not determined by a pharmacy, however a pharmacist should be able to determine the cheapest alternative and search who has them in stock.
- l. Katheryn PCSO Child Protection-Deterra bags are in the works. National ECC Court focusing on childhood trauma-training staff. Their division investigates abuse allegations. Trends are family violence, substance misuse and mental health with open investigations. If anyone is interested in coming to their agency and providing training, please contact Pasco County Child Protection.

- m. Dave, Eckerd-Removals and foster care 9/10 people that he speaks to have no idea the things that we talk about in this room. All are encouraged to share the flyers. Please share phone number, etc.
- n. Michael, TN24 wanted to give kudos to his house manager and give encouragement. Openings for men and women in sober living environment, structured and certified.
