II. INTRODUCTIONS: Chrissie Parris began the meeting at 10:05 AM. Groups were welcomed and introductions were done around the table. July minutes were passed with notation with correction for Marijuana Task Force.

III. GUEST SPEAKERS: DOH-Pasco County: Hep. B Data and Heroin discussion was facilitated by Garik Nicholson, MPH from DOH Pasco. Discussed was Acute Hepatitis, Epidemiology of, Statistics, At-Risk populations, Vaccination, Vaccination Efficacy,

Prevention, rates of infection. Discussed an acute increase in infectious cases and a jump in rates and how these may correlate with IV Drug use. West Pasco County is affected the most by these increases. Gender distribution was discussed with males being higher. Age 30 and above are most effected in age distribution. IV drug users account for 45.76% of new cases. Sexual contact account for over 30% of new cases. Truthfulness in reporting may cause variation in statistics. 61% have a history of incarceration. Discussed next steps in prevention to include vaccinations, genotype testing, mobile medical unit vaccinations, etc. Increasing in 30 plus age range and reaching out to certain facilities, including individuals whom are incarcerated. .

- IV. RX Committee- In Manatee County, stated that they have seen synthetic opioids used for sedating Elephant's_Carfentanil mixing with heroin. 10-12 doses of Narcan are needed to be used to reverse this overdose.

E-FORCE re-caps 47 registered and 36 attendees. Nikesha acknowledged that all help was appreciated. A discussion of what went well and what could have been improved occurred.

Town Hall Meeting is Oct 4 3:30-5PM at Morton Plant North Bay to talk about Naloxone. September meeting will be September 6th at NPR Public Library from 3:30-4:30 PM.
