II. INTRODUCTIONS: Chrissie began the meeting at 10:05 AM. Groups were welcomed and introductions were done around the table. Minutes were passed as written.

III. GUEST SPEAKERS:

- a. **Kent Runyon**, presented about Novus Medical Detox Center. Novus is currently expanding and is joint commission accredited. They have 33 beds (one person per room to pairs in a room available). Now accepting insurance. Laptops and cellphones are permitted as patients may continue to work. Novus serves a variety of clients (must have insurance), provides case management services, provides natural and traditional medical based solutions in detox, and supports transitions into treatment centers for post detox treatment.

- b. **Nicole John** presented on Premier's ER diversion at North Bay. The goal of the program is to reduce the misuse of the ER. Access to care is the overall issue. The program establishes a PCP with patients and schedules appointment and follow up. First visit with Premier is free. They provide bus passes for those struggling with transportation and are tracking if patients are returning to the ER rather than utilizing a PCP after utilizing the program. Staff works in the hospital Monday through Friday.
  
- IV. DCF PREVENTION DISCUSSION - Chrissie Parris led the discussion "*How can we target the youth that are involved in the DCF system. How do we break the cycle?*" Many ideas were shared, including education, providing information to those that lack it, getting children in the school more active, linking mentoring as an option, engaging with Early Childhood Court and group facilitations in the Land O' Lakes county Jails, and providing Anger Management and Guiding Good Choices Groups within the jail. This discussion will continue throughout the month.
  
- V. RX COMMITTEE UPDATE:
  - a. **Nikesha Yarbrough**, the PDMP Roundtable Discussions, will be August 2<sup>nd</sup>. Naloxone Roundtable is scheduled for September 16<sup>th</sup>, from 3:30 -5:00PM. Ask Nikesha for more information.

  - a. USF students have been working on tailoring Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome curriculum for educational purposes. They must provide this education by the end of June 2016.
  - b. Reps from Trinity Medical Center will be at PARR on Thursday the 26<sup>th</sup> of May to provide education to women who will be delivering their children at Trinity.
  - c. Postcards were dispersed at the meeting in order for attendees to write a note to women who are currently undergoing or considering substance abuse treatment.
