II. INTRODUCTIONS: Chrissie Parris began the meeting at 10:05 AM. Groups were welcomed and introductions were done around the table. February Meeting Minutes were approved as seen.

III. GUEST SPEAKERS:

- a. CHAT Coordinator Chrissie Parris and CHAT Lead Liana Dean reviewed CHAT program model, community partners, how CHAT partners with ASAP, who is CHAT-16 members consisting of leaderships, bachelors and masters level clinicians and LPN. Reviewed general program data and which zip codes CHAT services and what those services are. Reviewed at risk populations for youth and adults, specifically the zip code 34691 and analyzed this and assessed opportunities for improvement.

V. Legislative Update

- a. Whiskey and Wheaties
  - i. Christina Roberto gave update on legislation regarding new rules regarding alcohol being allowed to be sold at Big Box stores. It passed both the House and Senate and it will be debated on the floor and then sent to the Governor.
- b. Marijuana
  - i. Christina Roberto gave update on five different bills regarding marijuana. Briefly reviewed information of each legislation.

VI. STAND

- a. Kellie Walker gave update on Self-harm Awareness Month and how information was given to youth and how a specific youth was able to tell her story in the ASAP newsletter about her struggle with self harm. Kellie linked information about how STAND youth are going into areas that are highly alcohol marketed towards youth and then the youth are writing letters to their legislators discussing their concerns.

VII. Alcohol Initiative and Recovery Committee

- a. Meeting w/NPR City Council – Alcohol Awareness Month
  - i. The group drafted proclamation for alcohol awareness month and is educating legislators for alcohol in the community. The recovery committee is also joining these meetings.

  - ii. Art Rowand shared that the PSO is now starting to dispense is Nalaxone on both the west and east side of Pasco County.

- a. Monica Rousseau gave update on Medication Assisted Treatment New Grant Pilot Project and asked attendees to complete survey in person or online.
  - b. Monica Rousseau gave information about the Data Indicator Report:
    - i. Next issue is June 2017 and is currently data mining
    - ii. Reviewed number of nonmedical Rx opioids occurrences detected among decedents in Florida 2005-2015 and is currently increasing.
    - iii. Reviewed number of lethal Rx opioid and heroin occurrences among deceased persons in Florida 2000-2015
      - 1. Heroin is increasing
      - 2. Fentanyl-considered a prescription, however people are possibly dying due when people are injecting heroin it is laced with fentanyl
