INTRODUCTIONS:

Chrissie Parris, Chair, welcomed the group at 10:10. Introductions took place. Minutes were reviewed with one correction. There was a motion to approve and a second motion to approve. Coalition members present, approved.

I. GUEST PRESENTER:

Sharon Hall, Program Manager of MADD, presented about the Power of Parents . Attendees brainstormed ways to best utilize the resources presented by Sharon.

Phyllis Haley mentioned it would be helpful to have regular Power of Parents presentation with her clients.

II. ALCOHOL INITIATIVES:

Review of Shark Frenzy was given. All were invited to attend on May 14th at Anclote High School. Panelists include Superintendent Browning, Colonel Harrington from Pasco Sheriff's Office, Judge Shawn Crane, and many students.

Pasco Sheriff's Office conducted compliance checks over sparing break and out of 110 stores checked, 25 were non compliant for a 77% compliance rate. There were 9 non compliant the first night and it dropped to 6 by the 3rd night, so word got out.

Ideas for July 4th impaired driving #SafeRidePasco campaign will be generated for execution over July 4th weekend.

III. Data Discussion

The Indicator Report is still being updated and formatted. We are very data driven. We put our priorities on what the data shows us are the biggest problems. So, naturally, when we get Poison Control data shows only 4 cases of bath salts in Pasco, we think - good! However, in discussion with Poison Control and in meetings in the community we know that while we are making great improvements, there is still an issue in Pasco County that needs to be addressed. Discussion was held to brainstorm additional data sources. Also in recent meetings with schools, particularly schools in East Pasco, students and faculty are reporting continued prescription drug abuse and pill parties. However, this does not show as a trend in the FYSAS data. Discussion resulted in identifying several sources to approach including drug court, clerk of courts, school discipline reports, and hospital data.

Conclusion- the indicator report will be done by the conference, but for the next time we do it, there will be a team. If anyone would like to help contact Monica. Data is important because it all tells a different part of the story.

IV. SEN and RX COMMITTEE:

Monica shared new Drop Box Cards in two formats; one for doctors and doctor office staff to run through a list of questions with patients and the other for patients to have a list of questions to ask.

Liana Dean gave a brief overview on SEN projects including the updating of the manual and presentation used to introduce screening and resources for substance abuse to OBGYN offices.

V. CONFERENCE PLANNING:

The conference, *Strengthening Our Community*, is May 27th from 10am -4pm with a networking and vendor time starting at 9am. This year's conference is at Saddlebrook in collaboration with BayCare Behavioral Health's legislative appropriation.

Currently there were 280 people registered. The budget is set for 320 people and more sponsors are being approached.

VI. ASAP BUSINESS

The May ASAP meeting is cancelled due to the conference being held the day after the traditional meeting time.

The new ASAP website is Live! Everyone was encouraged to look through the website and offer suggestions and feedback to Monica.

National Prevention Week is May 17 - 23rd. The Shark Frenzy on May 14th will kick many campaigns off and all activities will culminate at the conference this year. For more information on how to participate, contact Monica.
