II. INTRODUCTIONS: Chrissie Parris called the meeting to order at 10:07am. Introductions of coalition members made via roundtable. May minutes to be revised to reflect that National Night Out to be held at Wiregrass Mall and not at the Trinity Target. Motion to approve May minutes made with one change (noted) by Missy Coyle and seconded by Sharon Schmidt. June Minutes passed as written. Motion to approve made by Stephanie and Sandra.

III. GUEST SPEAKERS:

- a. **Student panel of STAND youth; Safe Teens AgaiNst Drugs:** Students introduced and panel moderated by Sharon Schmidt. Youth were asked questions about substance abuse issues they have noted within their schools and community. Students addressed the struggles that they have faced, awareness techniques, the need for more education in schools and strategies for engaging youth in prevention. Students shared that many peers utilize substances for acceptance. It was also linked that students are often unaccounted for due to the teacher to student ration in some largely populated schools. It was linked that “many students come to school high or drunk.” Students linked that substance abuse happens often on campus. Students linked that there is a need for more awareness for students in schools. The students linked that parents should “be honest” with students and “give education” to tackle the issue with substance abuse. The students advocated for understanding rather than discipline and consequence when addressing a student that is abusing substances. STAND students linked that they participate in the STAND organization to stay busy and “get active” in order to combat “giving in to drugs because of boredom.” Students linked other coping mechanisms to implement rather than utilizing substances. The floor was opened for questions. Students were asked for the best way to provide education to students effectively. Students advocated for more advanced behavioral studies classes in school for high school students. The students also advocated for substance abuse prevention to some home be incorporated into their school curriculum. Stress reduction was considered, as well as mindfulness and yoga. Students advocated for more resources in order to be better equipped to respond to the demand of their peers. Students identified funding as an issue with providing the appropriate resources to the population in need. It was linked that funding is needed to access evidence based curriculum, the best practices and to share them. Students linked “Balling for Jesus”, Pasco Back-to-School Event. Students linked Social Media, and television as a reinforcement of substance abuse in teens; due to constant exposure to its use and the promotion of recreational drugs.
