III. GUEST SPEAKERS:

- a. Lissa Wiley, a member of the recovery community, was the guest presenter and spoke about her journey to recovery. Her powerful story reflected the influence of trauma on substance use initiation. She emphasized the need to address the

psychological trauma behind addiction in order to truly address the substance use disorder.

- b. Bonni Snider- a member of recovery committee, shared her story of recovery from the military perspective. She discussed the pressure of soldiers to drink alcohol as a way to bond with other soldiers.

IV. RECOVERY MONTH UPDATE:

- a. Kellie Walker announced that the Board of County Commission presented ASAP with a resolution to honor Recovery Month and the needs of those with addiction. She also announced that the Recovery Event Planning Committee decided to become a long-standing committee to continue the work of breaking down stigma throughout the year. Kellie announced the new chair people of the committee: Toni Reynolds and Lissa Wiley.
