I. Welcome and Introductions:

Tracey Kaly, Chair, welcomed Coalition Members at 10:10 a.m. Following introductions, minutes from the September and October meeting were reviewed. Eli noted his name was listed twice in the attendance section. With that one correction, a motion to approve both months meetings minutes was made by Scott Bigley and a second approval by Monica Rousseau.

Remaining members concurred with approval of September 2013 and October 2013 minutes as written.

II. Guest Speaker:

Jason Jackman with Walk Wise provided an interactive presentation on Safety Tips and facts for pedestrians and drivers. Jason is part of the Center for Urban Transportation Research at USF. For additional information go to the Walk Wise Website.

III. Alcohol Initiative:

A. Chrissie and Shelah discussed the Safe Festival Scan. Shelah explained the process and purpose of scans. The Safe Festival Scan Poster was shown to Coalition Members. This same poster will be brought to and used by Katy for her presentation at the CADCA Conference in Washington D.C. Chrissie and Shelah summarized main points on the poster.

B. Chrissie reported that serving alcohol at the Community Recreation Center was voted down.

IV. A.S.A.P. Business:

- A. Coalition Members were distributed a priorities ranking list re: possible 2014 focus areas for A.S.A.P. Members were asked to rank the priorities and discuss briefly with surrounding members. Chrissie then encouraged open sharing and discussion.
- B. Chrissie shared that she will be co-presenting with CFBHN at the CADCA Conference regarding Community Health and Wellness. She will bring back information to share at the February Coalition Meeting.

V. Marijuana:

Shelah distributed the Constitutional Amendment Petition Form that was used to get the marijuana proposal on the November 2014 ballot. Fact and informational sheets distributed. Shelah encouraged those with a particular interest in this issue to attend the Marijuana Task Force Meeting held on the first Tuesday of every month by invite only.

VI. Substance Exposed Newborn Committee and RX Committee:

Gabby reported that the SEN Committee is looking to set priorities/goals for the 2014 year at their next meeting. The SEN and RX Committee will be joining together as one committee beginning in February. Rick suggested the group consider adding in the effects of smoking, whether tobacco or marijuana into their goals.

Chrissie indicated that for the A.S.A.P. is going into the 55 and older communities for a pill drop at Heritage Springs on February 10<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 a.m. to 12 noon. It is a closed community event. A.S.A.P along with Pasco Sheriff's Office have also partnered with the Utility Company for a drop off event. This will include a variety of items that should not be disposed of into regular trash, from pills to batteries, etc. This one will take place February 15<sup>th</sup> at Anclote High School from 9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.

VII. Membership Roundtable:

Denise shared that she has been working at Vocational Rehab; assisting with those looking to get back into the work world. She indicated she will be reaching out to A.S.A.P. Members for possible support with employment opportunities for her clients.

Michael Adams with Probation shared that there will be a Community Resource Fair on March 27<sup>th</sup> with possible job connections on site.

Jodi Puskin with Tampa Times NIE brought some prevention publications, displayed on the back table and encouraged members to take what they needed.

Betsy Robinson with Career Central shared that they are being re-branded and will become "Career Source". She indicated they, along with Pasco Youth Initiative, are looking for chairs and co-chairs of various committees. Renee Shelton with Pace reported they are planning a College and Career Day on March 11<sup>th</sup> from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at PACE in Hudson. It's open to the community.
