III. GUEST SPEAKERS:

- a. Alan Wilkett from the Pasco County Sheriff's Office gave a human trafficking presentation and discussed that January is Human trafficking awareness month. Alan gave presentation on definition of human trafficking and what it looks like as a global, country, state, and local level. He discussed recent searches of strip clubs in Pasco County to ensure that they are following codes and ordinances. Alan talked about

evolution of Florida legislation (TVA, Safe Harbor Act) in regards to human trafficking. Also, he discussed statistics of victims involved in human trafficking 20.9 million in the world and global scope of the problem.

- b. Chrissie Parris BCBH-CHAT- group activity was tabled due to presentation.

- a. Nikesha Yarbrough updated that the Naloxone townhall is set for June and is going to work with Recovery Subcommittee on getting feedback on thoughts of overdoses and naloxone.

- a. Bonnie Snider updated that this committee received funding to present at CADAA about their initiatives in Pasco County in regards to decreasing impaired driving and Kellie Walker will be traveling to Washington DC to present.

VI. MARIJUANA TASK FORCE:

- a. Kent announced that Christina Roberto will be the new co-chair of the MJTF.
- b. Local medical marijuana information was discussed in regards to the CBD marketing in the area and it was asked that if others see CBD edible marketing in community to let MJTF or ASAP know.
- c. Various concerns of implementation of Amendment 2 and medical marijuana were discussed and those who showed interest were encouraged to attend MJTF meeting.

VII. SEN COMMITTEE

- a. Gabby discussed that SEN committee is working on projects of how to collect data on SEN babies that are born every year, but there is not a universal way to upload data.
- b. This committee is going to be doing a lot of community outreach events as to help with awareness of Safe Sleep program.
- c. It was announced that that Trinity hospitals are asking for volunteers for cuddling babies who are going through withdrawals.

- a. There is a new STAND club starting at PACE center due to increased interest.
- b. The MLK Youth Leadership Summit at Great Escape was explained and how the youth learned leadership skills and how to advocate to legislators.
